

Visual Impairment and Orientation & Mobility Teacher

This is a 1099 contractor position requiring approximately 90 minutes/month of vision and 400 minutes per year of orientation and mobility services.

Interested candidates will:

1. Work collaboratively with school personnel, parents/guardians, and outside agencies.
2. Communicate effectively, remain highly organized, and demonstrate excellent time management skills.
3. Evaluate and provide direct and indirect services for students suspected of, or identified, with visual impairments.
4. Provide strategies to facilitate accessibility. Train other staff members. Proficiency with assistive technology is required.
5. Present information clearly in group settings. Participate in IEP meetings. Attend staff meetings, conferences, in-services, and assigned events.
6. Create data-driven, individualized goals. Track and report progress.
7. Complete all required documentation within allotted timeframes.
8. Maintain confidentiality, professional integrity, and uphold school virtues.
9. Comply with federal, state, and district regulations, policies, and procedures.
10. Perform other duties as assigned.

The successful candidate will:

- Hold or be eligible to hold a valid WI DPI certification #1825 and/or #0060.
