SENIOR THESIS

All students will complete a capstone project that includes both an oral defense and a written essay of 10-15 pages. This is a requirement for graduation and a culmination of their high school work. Students employ the skills of reading, thinking, writing, and speaking in this culminating task. The thesis involves engagement with great ideas and great works and addresses an enduring human question.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT

LCCA courses are not part of AP Course Audit and are not called "AP" on transcripts. Students are welcome to take any AP test; no AP test is required of any student.
